## How They Do it in NJ ...

The second half of our name is outreach for a definite reason. Our events allow us to share God’s love. Ralph M. reports from Elizabeth, NJ: “This was our 13<sup>th</sup> year putting on our Thanksgiving Day marathon Meeting, and we had a total of 312 people; prayed with 35 for various needs or request; 8 salvations; 2 referred to Detox and rehab; 1 placed in a homeless shelter; 3 referred to food pantry.

We put out 30 pans of food of what was left over at the end of the day (around 8pm), and many of the homeless and poor came back to take them. Many in recovery spent the whole day with us, allowing us to fulfill the purpose of this meeting, to provide a place of refuge and help others stay clean yet another day.

We had 10 speakers sharing back to back, every hour on the hour, and they all did a great job sharing the hope and their experiences. God was glorified in this effort. On a personal note, Nov. 23 was my clean date and I celebrated 20 years by the Grace of God. Blessings”

The groups in this area of the country get together regularly and network within the community with terrific results and a lot of fun along the way. Summer retreats, concerts and “day in the Park” are some ways this fellowship offers the message of Christian recovery to the community.

## Recent Events ...

The same New Jersey O.O. group just celebrated 13 years of meeting together, with an attendance of 85 at the party.

Cedar Hill, TX group had a “Speaker Jam” Dec. 12th with food, games (volleyball, basketball) and eight speakers. The event was held in the gymnasium behind the church. A good turnout enjoyed the message of over 200 years of experience, strength and hope.

The South Lake Tahoe group at Sierra Community Church had a 20 year anniversary party with a “chili bar” pot luck and a chance to share a “scripture of the year” (instead of a New Year resolution). The event was well attended (about 50 people) and a good time was had by all.

## Upcoming Events

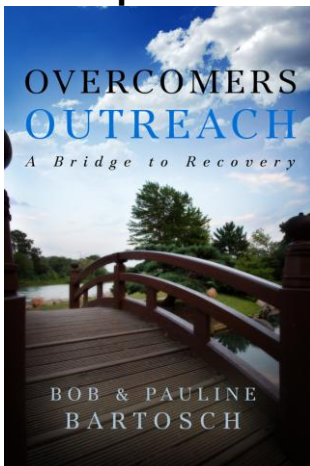

## Literature Update



Just in time to celebrate 25 years of Overcomers, the 3<sup>rd</sup> edition of our “Big Book” *A Bridge to Recovery* is at the printers and will be ready in April 2010. We are accepting orders for presales on our website, or you may phone or write the office to reserve your copy of the first printing. We ran into a delay and hoped to have them sooner but don’t worry, they are almost here after 2 years out of print!

Our newest pamphlets group the 12 steps into 4 sets of three each. *Surrender* looks at steps 1-3, *Cleaning House* is about steps 4-6, *Restoration* is about steps 7-9 and *Progress* looks at steps 10-12. The material is presented to correspond to the 4 “absolute” principles that the early Oxford Group developed for their program of evangelism, namely honesty, purity, unselfishness and love. These pamphlets may help to introduce the steps to congregations.

## Al-Anon in Australia

Anyone looking at my life would have thought it was “pretty perfect” – a seemingly happy marriage, 3 mostly lovely teenagers, a comfortable lifestyle, a nice new home, loads of friends and an active church life. But 3 ½ yrs ago that outward image was shattered when my husband had a major accident with a high range blood alcohol level, followed by another DUI offense 2 years later (and most people were not aware that he had been caught 12 years prior to that with a high-range reading). My world was turned upside down as I came to grips with my new reality – that my life was out of control and I was powerless to make things right again. I had been living in denial of a huge problem for a long time. For years I had put on a happy face, pretended that all was well, covered up problems we were having, laughed off his drunken-ness in front of friends, ignored worrying signs, kept quiet (when inside I was screaming), put up with erratic, irrational behavior and often cried when I was on my own. Hardest of all was trying to be a godly, loving wife and mother and putting on a “mask” every day. My cover-up was exposed with my husband’s very public court cases and subsequent loss of license and other consequences. With the help of loving advice I found myself at Al-Anon and OO.

In both these groups I have been able to accept the things I cannot change with some degree of serenity (sometimes it is with more frustration than serenity!) and have been able to change a lot of things in my own life that I wasn’t even aware of that needed changing. Knowing that my Higher Power is the God who created the universe enables me to really give my will over to Him and trust Him to help me through the messiness of this life. Jesus said that the wise man should build his house on the Rock (God) so that when the storms in life come, even

though we may be beaten about, we will not crumble and fall apart. I know that has been true of my own experiences.

I often still shake my head in disbelief and think “this can’t be happening to me!”- my husband has not found sobriety. I watch the disease progress daily and depend on God. This is happening to me, and I know with the one and only true God as my Higher Power I will be able to take one day at a time and get through whatever lies ahead.
